- February 2010 Project Completion






TBIT Interior Improvements & Baggage System Benefits










Hollywood/Highland Metro Red Line






Hollywood & Vine, Metro Red Line Station





Hollywood & Vine, W Hotel/Condos

- Line: Metro Red Line
- <u>Site</u>: <u>+</u>2.30 acres (some Metro-owned)
- <u>Development</u>:
 - 300-room W Hotel
 - 143 condominiums
 - 30,000 sq. ft. of ground floor retail
 - Improved/enlivened public plaza
 - New subway portal canopy, subway elevator and bike room
- **Est. Completion**: Q3 2009





Hollywood & Vine, Apartments


- Line: Metro Red Line
- <u>Site</u>: 2.35 acres of Metroowned property
- Development:
 - 375 apartments
 - 28,000 sq. ft. of ground floor retail
 - New bus layover facility
- **Est. Completion**: Q3 2009





North Hollywood

- Line: Metro Red & Orange Lines
- <u>Site</u>: Five Metro-owned parcels totaling approximately 15.5 acres
- Anticipated Development:
 - Landmark, high-density, creative arts-oriented, "town center" development with:
 - <u>+</u> 560 residential units
 - <u>+</u> 1 million s.f. of office space, 157,000 s.f of retail space & 35,000 s.f. of community space
 - 1,000 replacement and 500 additional transit parking spaces
 - underground subway/bus way link







Universal City Station

- Line: Metro Red Line
- <u>Site</u>: Approximately 12 acres of Metro-owned property
- Anticipated Development:
 - 24-story/624,000 s.f. NBC/Universal office bldg.
 - 5-story, 300,000 s.f. of NBC/Universal production/broadcast facilities
 - Ground floor retail
 - New 800 space transit parking structure (230 new spaces) over new 20 space bus layover facility
 - 18-story/400,000 s.f. office building (Phase II)
